Acts 8 – Describes The Expansion of The Church:

Acts 1:8

Acts 1-7 — Witness to Jerusalem — "and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem,"

Acts 8-12 - Witness to Judea and Samaria - "and in all Judea and Samaria,"

- 1. The Center of activity moves from Jerusalem to Antioch Syria.
- 2. The Message goes from the Jews to the Samaritans and then to Gentiles.
- **3.** Peter's prominence fades as Paul becomes the leader.
- **4.** The "Gospel of the Kingdom" is replaced by the "Gospel of the Grace of God."

Saul – "desired" or "Proud"; His name after his conversion was changed to Paul – "Small"

He was born in Tarsus in Cilicia – Acts 22:3 A Roman Citizen Acts 16:37; 22:25-28. "Hebrew of the Hebrews" 2 Cor. 11:22; Phil. 3:5

The "Son of a Pharisee" Acts 23:6; He became a devoted Pharisee Acts 26:4-5; Phil. 3:5; He was educated in Jerusalem by Gamaliel Acts 22:3

Saul's zeal for the Law was displayed in his persecution of the church Gal. 1:13-14; Phil. 3:6.

Paul described himself as "exceedingly mad against them" Acts 26:11, 1 Tim 1:13

"and they were all scattered"; "To scatter like seed"

The Basic Lesson of Stephen's Life – "Progress is impossible without sacrifice"
