2 Peter 1:1-15 – Peter spoke of "<u>The Walk With God</u>" – Now, 2 Peter 1:16-21 – Peter Speaks of "<u>The Word of God</u>."

2 Peter 3:3-4

In The Bible, Believers Have An Accurate, Written Revelation Of God's Truth!

Theme of 2 Peter – "Knowing And Growing In Christ."

2 Peter 1 – Faith's Convictions: Keep Following Jesus.

Thought Of The Passage: "The Reality Of Peter's Eyewitness Of Jesus Is Overshadowed By The Sure Reliability Of The Scriptures."

<u>1. Verses 16-18 – Realities Of The Facts Of Faith</u> <u>2. Verses 19-21 – Reliability Of The Facts Of Faith</u>

1. Verses 16-18 – Realities Of The Facts Of Faith:

2 Peter 1:16 – "For" – or "Therefore, indeed, or no doubt" – Peter has just reminded the believers about the facts of faith – Verses 12-15 – Repetition Of The Facts Of Faith: (Truth) 2 Peter 1:15.

Peter's Teaching Is Under Attack: "we did not follow cleverly devised tales" – "myths, spinning out cleverly invented stories, fictitious stories."

Paul Warned Timothy – 1 Timothy 4:7; 2 Timothy 4:4.

Paul Warned Titus – Titus 1:14 – "not paying attention to Jewish myths."

"power" – Greek word "dunamis" – we get our English word dynamite, dynamic power – Revelation 19:11-20:3.

Matthew 24:30; Matthew 28:18

"coming" – is the Greek word "parousia" which is used in the NT for the Second Coming. It speaks of "a personal presence."

Jesus used it – Matthew 24:27, 37.

We Saw The Divine: "but we were eyewitnesses" – "seeing with one's own eyes."

The best way for Peter to refute these false teachers was to reveal the incarnate life of Jesus Christ!

"<u>we</u> were eyewitnesses" – We Saw It! – The gospels reveal that only "Peter, James and John" were witnesses; Inner Circle. Why Three Disciples? Deuteronomy 19:15

"eyewitnesses of His majesty." – "The Transfiguration of Jesus" – Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 9:1-9; Luke 9:28-36 – "of His <u>majesty</u>."

John's gospel did not record the transfiguration, but John said... – John 1:14.

Matthew 17:1-2 – "transfigured before them;" – this is the Greek word "metamorphoo" – we get the word "Metamorphous" – "to change into another form, to transform". This Is The Visible Revelation Of The Nature Of Christ.

Isaiah 53:2

Matthew 17:5 – "<u>a bright cloud overshadowed them</u>," – This is called the "Shekinah glory" – 58X in the Bible – Exodus 40:35.

Jesus Was Encouraging His Disciples Through A Visible Revelation Of His Divine Nature. Context of the Transfiguration; Jesus announced His suffering and death – Mark 8:31.

There was evidence Jesus was God by what He did, but there was no visible evidence by looking at Him – Hebrews 1:3.

Matthew 17:2; Mark 9:2; Luke 9:29

"and they were talking with Jesus." – Luke 9:31.

The Old Testament to the Jews was Law and Prophets. "Moses" – was speaking of the necessity of the death of Jesus for the demand of the Law. "Elijah" – was speaking of the fulfillment of the promises in Bible Prophesy.

Peter leaves the following out – Mark 9:5-6.

2 Peter 1:17

We Heard God's Voice: "For when He received honor and glory from God the Father," – the term "honor" – "the exalted status given by God the Father to the Son" – "and glory" – "heavenly radiance of the transfigured Jesus."

Matthew 17:5

"a voice came out of the cloud," – There were 3 times in the Gospels that the Father spoke from heaven:

- 1. At The Baptism of Jesus Mark 1:11 Starting Of His ministry.
- 2. At The Transfiguration Mark 9:7.
- 3. Preparing For The Cross John 12:28.

"This is <u>My beloved Son</u>" – The words of the Father affirmed that Jesus was His Son (Equal to the Father) – "with whom <u>I am well-pleased</u>" – This was God the Father placing His stamp of approval upon all that Jesus had taught in His ministry.

"listen to Him!" – literally, "continually listen to". Discipleship is not built on visions or on men but on God's Word – John 10:27-28.

Matthew 17:6-7

2 Peter 1:18 – "holy mountain" – because the glory of Jesus was displayed, revealed there.

2. Verses 19-21 – Reliability Of The Facts Of Faith:

2 Peter 1:19

The Sure Word: "So we have the prophetic word (Scriptures) made more sure," – "we have the word of prophecy made more sure, reliable."

The Authoritative Word: "to which you do well to pay attention" – "please pay attention to the message."

Illumination – Scripture Gives Light For Those Who Walk In The Darkness: "as to a lamp shining (Torch) in a dark place," – "dark place," – "murky, dry and dirty room, neglected (world)" – Psalm 119:105.

2 Corinthians 4:4-6

"until the day dawns" – We are to rely upon the light of Scripture until it is replaced by the return of Jesus! – 1 John 3:2.

"morning star" – Venus, darkest just before dawn! Jesus is the Morning Star – Revelation 22:16.

Revelation 2:28

"arises in your hearts." – When we believe the Scriptures and Jesus enters into our lives!

2 Peter 1:20

"that no prophecy of Scripture" – reference to the prophecies of the Old Testament. Peter later refers to the Apostle Paul's writings as Scripture – 2 Peter 3:16.

"is a matter of one's own interpretation" – Only place in Scripture – "to unravel a problem." There are 2 views as to what this means:

 1^{st} View – Origination of Scripture – was never produced by the minds of men who wrote the text; No private linguistics. Prophets did not just write Scripture.

2nd View – Interpretation of Scripture – No human can interpret Scripture according to their personal whim. False teachers practiced this – 2 Peter 2:1; 3:16.

1 Peter 1:10-12 – They communicated the truth without fully understanding it!

2 Peter 1:21

"for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will," – The Source of Scripture not The Explanation.

The Inspired Word: "but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God." – Scripture came by the Holy Spirit who moved men to write the words.

"men moved" – "to bring or convey;" this word was used of sailing ships that were blown along by the wind.

There are 3 theories on the inspiration of Scripture:

1st Theory – The Dictation Theory – The Holy Spirit used human authors as secretaries through whom He dictated the Scriptures.

2nd Theory – The Verbal Plenary Theory – This theory teaches that authors were directed in their choice of words and that each part of the Bible is equally inspired.

3rd Theory – The Dynamic Theory of inspiration – The thoughts not the words are inspired.

The source of the Scriptures is the "breath" of God – 2 Timothy 3:16.

Application:

- 1. In The Bible, Believers Have An Accurate, Written Revelation Of God's Truth.
- 2. All That Mankind Can Offer Is Human Speculation. God, In Scripture, Is The Proclamation Of Divine Revelation.
- 3. The Word Is Compared To A Light, Which Shines In A Dark Place, Guiding The Believer Until The Day He Will Meet His Savior Face To Face.
- 4. The Reality Of Peter's Eyewitness Of Jesus Is Overshadowed By The Sure Reliability Of The Scriptures.
