Genesis – Deuteronomy is referred to as "The Law."

The Pentateuch – word penta- (Five) teuchos – (Scroll or Book) "Five Books"

Exodus - In the Greek language, means "The way out" or "Departing"

2 Peter 1:15

The Author – Moses Ex. 17:14

When Written - 1445-1405 BC

How could Moses Author this book?

- Revelation: From God to man (man hears that which God wants written)
- Inspiration: From man to paper (man writes that which God wants written)
- Illumination: From paper to heart (man receives the light of that which God has written)

Where it was Written - Egypt by Moses.

Period of Time – Exodus covers 431 years from Ex. 1-40

Purpose -

Exodus is the book of "Redemption." It records the deliverance of Israel from Egypt and presents the basic historical facts about the origins of the Hebrew nation and its religious ceremonies.

Theme – "Redemption" & "Deliverance"
