Of The 7 Churches, Only 2 Churches Jesus Did Not Need to Correct or Reprove: <u>Smyrna</u> and <u>Philadelphia</u>.

Revelation - "to unveil; to uncover."

Key Verse Of Revelation: Revelation 1:19

Thought Of Our Passage: Don't Be Fearful, But Be Faithful. Don't Look At The Suffering, But Beyond To The All-Controlling God.

- 1. Verse 8 The Author
- 2. Verse 9 The Approval
- 3. Verses 10-11 The Admonition

1. Verse 8 - The Author:

Revelation 2:8

"And to" – John just finished his letter to The Church of Ephesus, Revelation 2:1-7.

"the <u>angel</u> of the church" – The word "angel" – "messenger; minister". It is the pastor, Revelation 1:20.

(Map) "Smyrna" – literally, "bitter"; translated as "Myrrh" – aromatic gum that came from a thorny bush which is bitter but produced an aromatic perfume. City named for a perfume, "Smyrna".

Smyrna The City – 35 miles North of Ephesus, Population – 100,000, 1st Century ~ Today called "Izmir", population 2.8 million.

Smyrna was considered a great city of Asia.

Proud Patriotic City – had been involved in several civil wars, and each time, the residents sided with Rome.

Smyrna Was One Of The First Cities To Introduce The Worship Of Rome: Spirit of Rome, to gratitude for Rome, to peace of Rome, and finally to the god of Rome.

Citizens would receive a certificate indicating that they were accepted.

Smyrna had a large population of Jews – They were exempt from Caesar worship. The Jews were informants against the Christians.

Smyrna Represents The Period Of The Persecuted Church: 100-313 AD; In Church History – 5-7,000,000 Died.

The Church of Smyrna was persecuted because – They refused to call Caesar "Lord"; Would not worship Caesar.

Jesus Reveals Himself To The Church Of Smyrna – "The first and the last, who was dead, and has come to life, says this:"

Jesus The Eternal One – "The first and the last" – Revelation 1:17 – "I am the First and the Last" – Title for God, Isaiah 44:6; 48:12; 41:4; Jesus, equal nature of the Father.

"Was Dead" - "who became dead"

"Has come to life" – "who lives"; Resurrected Lord.

Jesus is revealed as the resurrected One: comes as the eternal one with no beginning and no end, the one who faced death and is alive.

2. Verse 9 - The Approval:

Revelation 2:9

"I know" – 7X, To all 7 Churches. Jesus is walking in the midst of the churches.

(NLT) Psalm 139:1-6

Jesus Reveals 3 Things He knew About The Church Of Smyrna:

 "Your Tribulation" – Literally, "pressure, serious trouble, burden that crushes."

1 Corinthians 10:13

Escape – nautical term; "used of sailors that would lighten their ship in the midst of a storm by throwing overboard weighty cargo."

John 16:33

Jesus Christ enables us to cope with life, to meet the pressures of life. Ezekiel 2:1-2

"Your Poverty" – Literally, "possessing absolutely nothing, nothing at all." Hebrews 10:34

Matthew 6:19-21

"But you are rich" – This is a sharp contrast to the words spoken to the

Church of Laodicea, Revelation 3:17.

"But you are rich" - Ephesians 3:8

3. "Blasphemy" – "slander, evil speaking" – Devil – The false accuser of the brethren.

1 Peter 4:14

"by those who say they are Jews and are not," – Romans 2:28-29

"but the Synagogue of Satan." - Revelation 3:9

Persecution has always purified the church; Godliness calls for persecution – 2 Timothy 3:12

3. Verses 10-11 - The Admonition:

Revelation 2:10

Don't Fear Suffering: "Do not fear" – "stop being afraid"; "what you are about to suffer" – Psalm 56:3.

Matthew 24:6 – "see that you are not frightened."

"the devil (responsible) is about to cast some of you into prison"

Job 1:8

1 Peter 1:7

"you will have tribulation 10 days" – a Greek expression for "short time, limited or allotted time."

Be Faithful: "Be faithful until death"

"I will give you the crown of life" – (stephanos) Not merit – we don't merit grace, The Crown is a gift. Same as the tree of life, Revelation 2:7, Revelation 2:11.

"He who Overcomes" – Every True Christian is an overcomer, 1 John 5:4-5.

"will not be hurt by the Second Death" – Rev. 20:11-15 – Lake of fire – Second Death.

- 1. The Purest Christian Graces Are Those Forged In The Furnace Of Adversity. Persecution And Trials Are Certain And An Essential Part Of The Christian Life.
- 2. False Christians Do Not Stay To Face Persecution, Because False Believers Do Not Want To Endure The Pain.
