### Matt 5:17-48 Christian's Righteousness:

**The Key Verse in the Sermon**: Matthew 5:20

Jesus gives 6 illustrations of Kingdom Righteousness. That our righteousness needs to surpass that of the Scribes and Pharisees.

Each one starts with the phrase: "You have heard." 6 X's

#### Jesus then says to the people - "But I say to you" 7 X's

#### 1. Verse – 21 Letter Of The Law:

• Matt 5:21

"You have heard that the ancients were told, Notice, it does not say "You have read in the Law of Moses"

The Jews were taken captivity (586-583 B.C.) to Babylon. Upon their return from captivity under Ezra and Nehemiah the people had lost their Hebrew dialect. They were not speaking or reading Hebrew, but Aramaic.

- Only the Priests of the Rabbinical schools held to the dialect

- The people were dependent upon the priests to expound the Old Testament Scripture

The Bible Teaches War - • 1 Sam 15:3

The Bible Teaches Capital Punishment - • Gen 9:6

Jesus has placed a responsibility on the Governments of the world to execute justice: • Rom. 13:1-7 to bear the sword and bring wrath.

'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT MURDER' It should be translated "shall not murder" as opposed to "not kill"

**Murder** – "the offense of unlawfully killing a human being with malice afore thought, expressed or implied."

- Numbers 35:30
- Luke 16:15

#### 2. Verse - 22 Spirit Of The Law:

• Matt 5:22

**Preserving Human Relationships:** Jesus considers anger as equal to murder. Angry - "festering, brooding, wrathful anger"

Anger is not always sinful: • Eph 4:26

- **1. Righteous Anger** It is motivated by that which is right. This is set on fire by the alter of heaven. Ps. 119:53
  - Mark 3:5

**Anger Over Sin** – (• John 2:13-22) Jesus in the Temple over turned the table and ran the religious leaders out.

- Gal 2:14 Paul rebuked Peter publicly because of his hypocrisy.
- **2. Unrighteous Anger** This anger is personal it is against us not God. Something that offends us, that brings irritation. It can involve our pride.

**Anger Against People** - Jesus says that it's murder. The anger that desires revenge, that wants to destroy. (Personal anger)

• 1 John 3:15

**Wrong Form of Anger Is Blowing Up**: Eph 4:26 AND YET DO NOT SIN;

**Wrong Form of Anger Is Claming Up**: Eph 4:26 do not let the sun go down on your anger.

This is also speaking about putting a limit on our anger.

• Eph. 4:27

**Raca** – Aramaic word for an (Insult) - act of contempt. "Empty, vain, lack of intelligence, we would say, Block head, Numskull, Bonehead, Brainless, Jerk, idiot, or "Air head"

and whoever shall say, 'You fool,' Fool - (Character Attack) moral
attack: attack on a persons character Literally "Moros" - word "Moron"
- slur on reputation.

## **Application:**

#### **Two Things We Can Do:**

- 1. **Admit** Confess that we are guilty and it is clearly a sin. Words of contempt, words that destroy and attack ones character. (Without a cause is unrighteous anger)
- 2. **Repent** Change of mind, change in thinking. It is to turn from our way and turn to another.
  - 1. Turn from anger Stop allowing anger to control you
  - 2. Turn to Christ
- 1. **Negative** Don't sin in unrighteous anger, personal pride for self.
- 2. **Positive** Righteous anger, hate for sin, and the things that God hates.
- 3. **Reason** Brooding in anger is out of control, gives the devil an opportunity to come in and destroy.
