- 2. The Church's sending out Paul and Barnabas: Acts 13:1-3

Fasting - means "to lay aside any pleasurable and/or vital activity for a period of time in order to intensely pursue God and know His mind with the intent of obeying His revealed will."

3. Fasting and What Jesus Taught:

Matt 6:16

Fasting was expected: 16 "And whenever you fast". Note again 17 "But you, when you fast".

Why Do The Religious Fast? (Seen by men)

How should the Christian Fast?

Matt 6:18

Our fasting is personal: so that you may not be seen fasting by men, but by your Father who is in secret;

Why Does The Christian Fast?: and your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

What is the reward of fasting?: God's presence, and God revelation of His will.

Application:

When should we fast?

- 1. When we feel a special pull, an urge to get alone with God
- 2. There are times when special needs arise
- 3. There are times when we need to humble ourselves before God
- 4. There are times when we need a very special power
