## All 3 Gospel's record this miracle of the cleansing of a Leper. (Matt 8:1-4; Mark 1:40-45; Luke 5:12-16)

#### Why Did Jesus Perform Miracles?

- 1. Jesus Wanted To Meet Human Need
- 2. The Miracles Were Additional Credentials To Prove Jesus is "The God Who Serves" (Isa. 29:18-19; 35:4-6)
- 3. The Miracles Were "Sermons In Action, Living Parables"

**The Thought Of Our Passage:** "A Desperate Person Appealing To Jesus In Faith/Humility Is In The Position To Be Touched By God"

#### 1. Verse 40 – The Desperate:

Mark 1:40

Mark 1:39

Casting Out Demons – God's Servant's Power To Deliver From <u>Cruelty Of</u> Sin.

Cleansing Of Leprosy – God's Servant's Power To Deliver From The <u>Defilement Of Sin</u>.

Matt 8:1 Luke 5:12

In the last 20 years, over 15 million people have been cured of this disease. Approximately 6.5 million people World-wide have leprosy.

"Leprosy" is now called "Hansen's Disease"

There are 3 Types of Leprosy:

- 1. "Nodular," or "Tubercular Leprosy"
- 2. "Anesthetic Leprosy" "Called Progressive Death."
- 3. "Leprosy Proper"

Leviticus 13-14

Deeper Than Skin (Lev 13:3)

Starts As A Little White Spot, Then Spreads (Lev. 13:5-8)

Defiles And Separates (Lev. 13:44-46)

Fit Only For The Fire (Lev. 13:47-59)

Religiously – Leprosy was used by Isaiah as a picture of sin (Isa. 1:4-6)

Socially - Lev. 13:45-46

Economically – They could not work because of being defiled.

Physically – The outlook was a slow lonely death; Daily becoming more crippled.

Mentally – They had no one; they were out, all alone.

Leprosy is a description of sin – It is never said that the Leper was <u>healed</u> but that the leper was <u>cleansed</u>.

The very Laws that condemned Leprosy lacked the ability to remove it, as the Law could not remove sin from the sinner. Romans 8:3

#### 4 Things Notable About This Man's Approach To Jesus:

 Leper Came In Desperation: Mark 1:40 – "a leper came to Him," – (Leper/Sinner)

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Luke 5:12 – "full of leprosy;"

John 6:37
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Matt 5:3-4

2. Leper Came to Jesus Begging: "beseeching Him," – "to call near, invite, invoke call for, desire, entreat, pray"

Romans 10:9-10

3. Leper Came In Humility: "falling on his knees before Him," – "the act of imploring aid, and of expressing reverence and honor"

Psalm 51:17

"Men will Not Be Lost Because They Are Too Bad, But Because They Are Too Proud!"

1 Peter 5:5

4. Leper Came To Jesus in Faith: "saying to Him, 'If You are willing, You can make me clean.'"

There were people whom God did not heal because of a greater purpose.

Only hope for his life was a miracle! The only answer was a miracle from Jesus! Romans 10:13

#### 2. Verses 41-42 – The Servant:

Mark 1:41

"And moved with compassion," – Literally, "Gripped with compassion, or He was gut wrenched"

"He stretched out His hand, and touched him," - Literally, "He took hold of"

Mark 1:42

(Physical) "immediately the leprosy left him"

(Spiritual) "and he was cleansed."

1 John 1:7

#### 3. Verses 43-44 – The Instructions:

Mark 1:43

"He sternly warned him" - "This was an in your face command; order"

Mark 1:44

One's Testimony is great and has its place, but should never replace a changed life.

Lev 14:1-32

### 4. Verse 45 – The Blabbermouth:

Mark 1:45

Some Have Good <u>Motives</u> For Disobeying God's Commands, But It Will Always Result In The Hindering Of God's Plan.

#### Application:

- 1. "Cleansing Of Leprosy Reveals That Jesus, God's Servant, Has Power To Deliver From The Defilement Of Sin."
- 2. "The Leper Approached God On His Terms: He Came In Desperation, In Humility, Requesting In Faith For Jesus To Cleanse Him, And Jesus Did."
- 3. "One's Testimony Is Great And Has Its Place, But Should Never Replace A Changed Life."
- 4. "Some Have Good Motives For Disobeying God's Commands, But It Will Always Result In The Hindering Of God's Plan."
