- 5. This Letter is Written That The Church Would Glorify God 1 Timothy is a letter of order in telling the Church How to look and act if it is to glorify God. 1 Timothy 6:20

The Author - Paul - 1 Tim 1:1 Paul,

When Written – Probably in 66-67 AD

Where it was Written – The place of the writing was Macedonia, probably from Philippi. 1 Tim 1:3; 3:14-15

Written To – Timothy 1 Tim 1:2 to Timothy,

Background: 1 Timothy Written between Paul's two Roman imprisonments, Acts 20:29-31

1. Verse – 1 The Blessed Messenger:

1 Tim 1:1

His Name – Paul – In Paul's pre-Christian life, he was known as Saul of Tarsus, the persecutor of the church Acts 7:58; 8:1, 3; 9:1. Philippians 3:5

Saul's Conversion - Acts 9:1-18

Paul – The Latin word paulus means "little or small"; The English noun pauper is derived from it.

Paul's Position: "an apostle" -

apostle – "one who is sent forth; carries the thought of official and authoritative sending with necessary equipment"

Apostles – were those believers who had <u>seen the resurrected Christ</u> and who had <u>been commanded directly by Jesus to preach</u> and lay the foundation for the church age, Eph. 2:20. Their ministries were

<u>authenticated by miracles</u>. Paul thus qualified for this authoritative position, 2 Corinthians 12:12

"of Christ Jesus" - The name "Christ Jesus" is used 3X in 1 Tim 1:1-2

"commandment" – word is a military term literally means "upon the order or rank of"

"commandment" means "a royal commission"; Both Paul and Timothy were sent by the "King of Kings!"

God our Savior, The Heavenly Father is identified as "God our Savior"

"hope" – is "a fully confident expectation of an as yet unrealized fulfillment"

Jesus is the substance and foundation of our spiritual optimism.

Col. 1:27

2. Verse - 2 The Blessed Relationship:

1 Tim 1:2

His Name – Timothy's – "honor" (timaō) and "God" (theos). "Timothy was one who honored God and one whom God honored"

Timothy's Position – "my true child in the faith": The word "true" or "own" literally means "nothing spurious, genuine, lawfully begotten"

"my true child" - used one other person, Titus. Titus 1:4

1 Corinthians 4:17

Philippians 2:22

Timothy's Background – He lived in Lystra, Acts 16:1; He was well spoken of by the brethren; Timothy was gifted – 1 Tim 1:18; 4:14

Timothy's Father was a Gentile – Acts 16:1; Timothy's Mother (Eunice) was a Jew, Acts 16:1

His Mother & Grandmother (Lois) taught him the Scripture as a child, 2 Tim 1:5; 3:15

Timothy's Personal Problems:

- 1. Timothy was Young 1 Tim 4:12
- 2. Timothy was Timid and Shy 1 Tim 4:14; 2 Tim 1:6-8
- 3. Timothy was Sickly 1 Tim 5:23

Marks of a Genuine Child in the Faith:

- 1. Saving Faith A man of God 1 Tim 6:11 -12
- 2. Continual Obedience 1 Tim 4:6, 12
- 3. Humble Service Romans 16:21
- 4. Sound Doctrine 1 Tim 4:6, 11: 1 Tm 6:2
- 5. Courageous Conviction 1 Tim 1:18; 6:20

3. Verse - 2 The Blessed Resources:

Nature of the Greeting: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

Three Blessings Are Requested For Timothy:

1. God's Grace – "the constant outpouring of divine favor upon undeserving men" John 1:16

God's Saving Grace -

God's Continued Grace -

2. God's Mercy – "mercy" stresses "divine compassion and pity".

Mercy does not free us from the consequences of sin, but from the misery that accompanies it"

Psalm 103:13-14

3. God's Peace – the term "peace": the result of grace and mercy. This type of peace is based upon judicial peace with God, which is gained at regeneration

"from God the Father" – The Father is the ultimate source of all blessings, whereas the Son is the channel. Ephesians 1:3
