Three of the gospels record this miracle of Jesus walking on the water – Matt 14:22-36; Mark 6:45-56; John 6:15-21

Mark 4:35-41 – Jesus with His disciples in a storm.

This storm is addressed to weary Christians that are "Straining At The Oars!"

Thought Of Our Passage: "The Weary Obedient Disciple Of Jesus, Need Not Fear, Because Jesus Will Come In Our Hour Of Darkness"

1. Verses 45-48 – The Difficulties Of Obedience:

Mark 6:45

Mark 6:33-44

"made" - "constrained, to compel, drive to, whether by force, or threats"

Why Did Jesus Force His Disciples Into The Boat? John 6:15

"and go ahead of Him" - "Jesus would follow later"

Luke 9:10 – Bethsaida was a suburb of Capernaum.

John 6:17 – "Go to Capernaum."

Mark 6:53 – Gennesaret was next to Capernaum.

Mark 6:46

Jesus Was Dependent Upon Prayer: "He departed ("fled") to the mountain to pray."

Mark 14:38

The following day, Jesus' earthly ministry would change forever. John 6:66

Mark 6:47

"boat was in the midst of the sea," – John 6:19

Mark 6:48

God Sees Our Difficulties: "And seeing them straining at the oars,"

This Is Supernatural – Jesus is seeing the disciples several miles away in the dark!

"straining" – "to torture with grievous pains of body or mind, to torment, to be harassed"

Note This Storm Was The Result Of Obedience:

Jesus Is Praying For Us. Heb. 7:25

"for the wind was against them," - "contrary"

"fourth watch of the night," – This is 3-6 AM

2. Verses 48-56 – The Delight Of Obedience:

Mark 6:48 – "He came to them, walking on the sea;"

1 Corinthians 10:13

Acts 27 – Paul was on a voyage to Rome, in a storm.

Why Would Jesus Pass By? So that the disciples would recognize Him, and invite Him into their boat.

Mark 6:49

"it was a ghost," - "spirit, apparition"

Jesus will use a storm as a passageway into our lives!

"cried out; " - "To cry from the depths of the throat"

Mark 6:50

The Word From God Brought A Calm: "But immediately <u>He spoke with them</u> and said to them, '<u>Take courage; it is I, do not be afraid.'</u>"

The Word Of God Encourages – "Take courage;" Job 9:8

The Word Of God Drives Us To God – "it is I,": This is no other than the great "I Am!" Ex. 3:14

The Word Of God Instructs Us – "do not be afraid." Is. 43:1-2

Matt. 14:28-31

Mark 6:51

"the wind stopped;" - Literally "the wind stopped suddenly"

John 6:21

When we invite Jesus into our boat, the miraculous takes place.

Mark Records The Inward Response – "they were greatly astonished,": Literally "They were out of their minds, insane, to be beside oneself"

Matthew Records The Outward Response - Matt. 14:33

Worship – "is acknowledging who God is, it is praising Him for who He is and what He has done" (Inward and outward)

Mark 6:52

"heart was hardened." – Literally, "petrify, cover with a thick skin; metaphor – to lose the power of understanding, to be stupid"

Mark 6:53 – Western side close to Capernaum, about 4-6 miles.

Mark 6:54-55

John's account reveals that some did not want the spiritual but just the material blessings from the Lord. John 6:26

Mark 6:56

Number 15:38

The object of your faith saves you!

There are countless people that are going through storms this day that don't recognize Jesus nor invite Him in!

Application:

- 1. Jesus Was Dependent Upon Prayer. Jesus Fled To The Mountain To Pray.
- 2. The Weary Obedient Disciple Of Jesus Need Not Fear, Because Jesus Will Come In Our Hour Of Darkness.
- 3. In A Storm, Always Look For Jesus And Invite Him On Board.
- 4. Worship Is Acknowledging Who God Is, Then Praising Him For Who He Is And What He Has Done.
