God's Purpose Of The Law Is To Properly Identify The Root Cause Of Mankind's Failures. The Failure Is Not The Law But Sin!

Romans 7:7 – "What shall we say then? Is the Law sin?" – Paul has established that the law cannot save – Romans 3-5; The law can't sanctify – Romans 6; The law can no longer condemn a believer – Romans 7:1-6; Now, the law can convict both unbelievers and believers – Romans 7:7-13.

Romans 7:7-25 – the first person singular pronouns, "I," "me," and "my," no fewer than 46X; Autobiographical. "Romans 7 is Paul's autobiography which is the biography of every man."

Romans 6-8 - Sanctification

Thought Of Our Passage: "All The Blame For Sin And Death Falls On Our Sinful Nature, Not On God's Law Which Remains Good."

1. Verse 7 - Law Reveals Sin:

Romans 7:7

NLT Romans 7:7 – "Well then, am I suggesting that the law of God is evil? Of course not! The law is not sinful, but it was the law that showed me my sin. I would never have known that coveting is wrong if the law had not said, "Do not covet."

"What shall we say then?" – Context: Romans 7:1-6 – Spiritual Man Is Released From The Law: We have died to the law through Christ's body in order to belong to Christ: Romans 7:4.

The Law aroused our sinful passions so that we bore fruit for death: Romans 7:5.

We have been released from the law in order to serve God in newness through the Holy Spirit: Romans 7:6.

"Is the Law sin?" – A sensitive Jew, after reading Paul's argument, Romans 5:20; 6:14; 7:1-6. Is Paul placing the Law and sin in the same category? Is the Law sin? "Is the law sinful?" "Is the Law sin?" Paul's 3rd question.

1) Romans 6:1-2; 2) Romans 6:15; 3) Romans 7:7; 4) Romans 7:13.

"May it never be!" – "Certainly not! By no means! God forbid! On the contrary,_It's actually the opposite!" Romans 7:12

The Purpose Of The Law Is To Reveal Sin: "I would not have come to know sin except through the Law;" – When Paul says "I," he speaks for "Himself," he speaks for "Adam," for "Israel," "All humanity."

"I would not have come to know sin except through the Law;" – Romans 3:20.

"to know sin" – the principle of sin in the heart, depravity. Speaks of a practical experiential conviction of sinfulness, Acts 9:1-18; 26:14.

"COVET" – "lust, any illicit desire, all lusting or irregular desire, evil desire was sin." The 10^{th} Commandment, Exodus 20:17, deals with the motives of the heart.

Colossians 3:5 – "greed, which amounts to idolatry." Putting desires before God, thus lust becomes another god!

Philippians 3:4-6 – It was the 10th Commandment that slew Paul.

James 1:22-25

The purpose of the law is to reveal to men their sinfulness and inability, and their need of deliverance, which only God can bring!

2. Verse 8 – Law Provokes Sin:

Romans 7:8 – "But sin, taking opportunity" – Greek word used in "a military commercial contexts for the base of operations, for an expedition or a war"

The Law Provokes Sin: "through the commandment, produced in \underline{me}'' – Romans 7:5.

"coveting of every kind;" – "Sin launched an attack against man and viciously and deceptively used the commandment as a foothold for the advance."

It all started in Genesis 2-3; Adam and Eve were given a commandment, Proverbs 9:17.

"for apart from the Law sin is (was) dead." - Sin is and was dormant.

3. Verses 9-11 - Law Condemns Sin:

Romans 7:9 – "And I was once alive apart from the Law;" – Some say it was in Paul's youth, before his Bar Mitzvah, prior to becoming a "Son of the law."

Ignorance is no excuse under law, but it does give a sense of guiltlessness at the same time! Ignorance is bliss!

"but when the commandment came," - Romans 7:7.

"sin became alive," – "sin revived, sprang to life;" Romans 5:20; 1 Corinthians 15:56.

"and I died;" – I became conscience of my resistance to, and alienation from God. I was exposed as a sinner, goodness was rubbish!

Romans 7:10 – "and this commandment, which was to result in life," – If a person perfectly obeys the requirements of the Law they will live; have life! Romans 10:5; Leviticus 18:5; Deuteronomy 4:1; Galatians 3:21-22

The law promised life to those that fulfilled the law's requirements perfectly, James 2:10.

"proved to result in death for me;" – God does not grade on the curve. The breaking of the law results in the curse! Deuteronomy 11:26-28; 2 Corinthians 3:6

Paul interprets the curse of the Law as being God's condemnation and eternal death! Romans 5:15,18

Romans 7:11 – "for sin, taking an opportunity" – Greek word used in "a military commercial context for the base of operations, for an expedition or a war." "through the commandment,"

"deceived me" – The Aim of Sin is to Deceive. Sin promises blessings, joy that can't be delivered, 2 Corinthians 11:3.

"and through it killed me." - "to kill off."

4. Verses 12-13 - Law Reveals Sin's Sinfulness:

Romans 7:12 – "Law is holy," – William Barclay said "a sphere other than this world. The law is divine and has in it the very voice of God." It is set apart by God for a specific purpose.

"righteous and good." – It is that which is right and the absence of what is not right. Regardless of Human Abuse, God's Divine Law Remains Good! Psalm 19:7-11

Romans 7:13 – "Therefore" – The Commandments are holy righteous and good; it is man's sinfulness that is the problem.

"did that which is good become a cause of death for me? May it never be!"

- "If when I see the Law and I find myself wanting to break it, and I find myself stacking up sins that are going to lead me to judgment, am I to conclude that the law is sin?"

"it was sin, in order that it might be shown to be sin by effecting my death through that which is good," – The Law Is Exonerated, It's Sin's Fault!

Application:

- 1. The Purpose Of The Law Is To Reveal To Men Their Sinfulness And Inability, And Their Need Of Deliverance Which Only God Can Bring.
- 2. Human Nature Is Inherently Rebellious. Give Us A Law And We Will See It As A Challenge To Break It. Jesus Can Forgive Our Law-Breaking. He Gives Us The Holy Spirit Who Imparts A New Desire And Ability So That Our Greatest Pleasure Becomes Bringing Pleasure To God.
- 3. We Must First Be Slain By The Law Before We Can Be Saved By His Grace.
- 4. All The Blame For Sin And Death Falls On Our Sinful Nature, Not On God's Law, Which Remains Good. We Need New Hearts, Not New Laws Or No Laws.
