Ambition – literally, "act of soliciting for votes; an ardent desire for rank, fame, or power"

Godly Ambition – has as its goal the very glory of God. That God would work in and through me. I will make myself available for God's exclusive use. That how ever He would see fit, that my life would be used in His service to win the lost and minister to the saints.

Worldly Ambition – the focus is upon oneself. What I desire and what others think regarding me is more important then the glory of God. There is the desire for authority in order to control others and to make one self great in the eyes of the world.

Servant – Greek word diakonos (deacon); the word dust is from the root word. Literally “one who raises dust in hurrying to minister”; to run on errands, one who executes the commands of another, esp. of a master.
